

### **GOVERNANCE**

The Buchanan Hall governing structure includes a Board of Directors and a non-voting Board of Advisors. The day-to-day operations are run by a Board Executive Committee and a part-time Administrative Director.

## The Board of Directors

- <u>Dan Allen</u> joined the board in 2018 and serves on the Marketing Committee. Mr. Allen is a DC-area native who purchased a house in the Village of Upperville several years ago. After 20 years of experience as a federal contractor for the Army, Navy and Dept. of Justice, he formed Alakai Solutions to provide cyber security and technology strategy consulting services. Mr. Allen and his wife Anne have a son, Daniel, in high school, and two daughters, Lani and Brandy, at Columbia University doing their undergraduate and graduate studies.
- <u>Carmen Arwine</u> joined the board in 2015 and serves on the Events Committee. Mrs. Arwine grew up in Waterford, Virginia and later taught second grade in the Loudoun County school system. She and her husband Jason, an Upperville native, live in Upperville with their daughter Patty. Carmen has always cherished her local heritage and has called Upperville home for nearly two decades.
